    - o Etc.
  - Morgantown's guide includes what we have already in place, what we would like to see in the future, and realistic goals to work towards.
  - This plan sets up a number of guidelines, not policies.
  - It will be a living document, ever changing with the progress of the city
  - This guide will be available to view on the City of Morgantown's website as well as the Green Team's website

- 2. Mountain View (MTV) Solar: West Virginia owned company based out of Charleston using U.S. made products. Offering both Residential and Commercial solar technologies.
  - Hope to establish solar technologies and policies in Morgantown
  - For renewable energy sources and job development
  - They provide the option to adopt solar technologies
  - Offer tax incentives: 30% uncapped federal tax credit
  - A culture to produce a greater quality of life
  - Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations
  - Advocate net metering

- 6. Crossroads Visioning Meeting update
  - City Planner Chris Fletcher asked Chris Haddox to participate in the focus group meetings
  - Visioning will go towards the Morgantown Comprehensive Plan
  - A group out of Ohio will be drawing up the plan

- 7. Tom Arnold with Solid Waste Authority update:
  - The Solid Waste Advisory Board completed a number of studies in neighboring states' university cities in 2007.
  - A consolidated report was put together in 2009 to offer suggestions for solving problems within trash management. It addresses:
    - Waste reduction
    - Student housing
    - Problems existing internally
    - Residential recycling in student housing areas
    - Partnering with neighborhood associations
  - Studies show there is an extremely low percentage being recycled annually in Morgantown.
    - Approximately 14,400 tons of solid waste/ year is collected,
    - Of that, only 600- 700 tons is recycled
  - The goal is to change the culture of waste management
  - A proposition will be composed and presented before the committee of the whole to determine next steps. The presentation will include the following propositions:
    - Single stream recycling services- for convenience, to encourage more recycling
    - Culture Change
      - No voting on this proposition will occur immediately
      - Recommendations will be expressed verbally

Ella's interest on the topic consists of a pay/ bag mandate ("pay as you throw") to encourage waste reduction and equitability.
